The Revd Robert Fletcher

Vicar of St John the Baptist, Aldenham

Robert was brought up in Chalfont St Peter, but the church he remembers most while growing up was St James, Gerrards Cross.

After leaving school at the age of eighteen, he started working in the shipping business, eventually becoming a shipbroker in the city of London. He worked there for about seven years before being asked to work in the Aberdeen office, with the offshore supply ships and business relating to the North Sea oil.



It was in Aberdeen that he started attending a church, St Devenick's, Beildside, which was to change his life completely.
